

ITEMS OF INTEREST FOR 2009

1. Your club book has a new look. It has been condensed to reduce printing costs and has been formatted so it can be easily distributed electronically as an extra cost saving measure.
2. Please give us your email address. We would like to distribute future newsletters, announcements and reminders electronically. This will save us substantial printing and postage expense. Go to your computer now and email us at macalgrove@acegroup.cc so we can add your name to the list.
3. **DEBT REDUCTION FEE:** All single golf memberships will pay \$50 and all family golf memberships will pay \$75. This fee goes directly to reducing Ma Cal Grove Country Club's long term debt. One dollar per round is NOT an option in 2009. Debt reduction payments from social members wishing to help reduce the debt load of their club will be gladly accepted.
4. All memberships will be required to purchase clubhouse credit. This money will be kept on account and may be used any day of the week for all purchases except annual fees and tournament entry fees. Any unused credit will carry over to the following year. Credit purchase requirements are based on the type of membership purchased and participation in men's night.
5. In 2009, we will again offer members a 10% discount on their purchases. However, instead of giving it on individual purchases, we are offering it up front when you make a deposit into your clubhouse credit account.
6. A reciprocal golf agreement with Ferndale Country Club will be available to members for the 2009 season. Agreements with other courses were still being explored at the time this book went to print.
7. Shareholders who have not purchased a 2009 membership or maintenance fee will not be allowed to play in club hosted tournaments.
8. Richard Malinowski, golf teaching professional, will be offering lessons again this season. You may schedule a lesson by calling him at 507-895-8901.

Shareholder: Person or persons who own share(s) of stock in Ma Cal Grove Country Club, Inc.

Active Member: A shareholder who has paid current year membership dues.

Inactive Member: A shareholder who has paid a maintenance fee only, through current year.

Shareholder in Arrears: A shareholder who has not paid a current year membership or maintenance fee for current or previous year(s).

GENERAL CLUB POLICIES

SHAREHOLDERS: You must be a shareholder to purchase a membership. No share of stock may be sold or transferred without the approval of the Board of Directors. Shares may be obtained for \$150 along with annual membership dues. The share is a one-time charge. Check with manager for the availability of shares.

OBLIGATIONS: Each active shareholder is required to serve, when assigned, at club functions. Members over the age of 75 are not assigned to committees but are welcome to volunteer. Please check the calendar for your committee assignment. If you do not work, you will be assessed \$50 per person or \$100 per couple. Please pay promptly in the Pro Shop. *If this fee is not paid, it will be added to next year's dues.*

MAINTENANCE FEE: Shareholders who do not pay membership dues by May 1 will be required to pay green fees until dues are paid. A \$50 maintenance fee is due May 15, if dues are not paid. Shareholders purchasing only Monday memberships will be required to pay the \$50 maintenance fee. If neither dues nor maintenance fee is paid, all privileges will be forfeited. *Shareholders behind in their maintenance fee will not be allowed to play in club hosted tournaments.*

RIDING CARTS: All annual cart lease contracts require a contract and damage waiver to be signed and paid in full before a key will be issued. Daily rentals will require a daily damage waiver to be filled out before a key will be issued. Carts will be rented for the posted amount regardless of how many golfers will be using the cart. Golfers must be at least 17 years of age and have a valid driver's license to rent and operate rental riding carts on golf course property. Golfers must be at least 16 years of age to operate private riding carts on golf course property.

CLUB CREDIT: All memberships will be required to purchase clubhouse credit. This money will be kept on account and may be used any day of the week for all purchases, except annual fees and tournament entry fees. Any unused credit will carry over to the following year. Credit purchase requirements are based on the type of membership purchased and participation in men's night.

DEBT REDUCTION FEE: All golf memberships are required to pay a debt reduction fee based on type of membership purchased. This fee goes directly to reducing Ma Cal Grove Country Club's long term debt. All non-members who play in club sponsored tournaments are required to pay an additional \$10 per entry fee. This will also go directly to reducing long term debt.

TEE TIMES: Tee times will be in effect seven days a week. Tee times can be reserved one week in advance. *All groups must check in at the Pro Shop before going to the first tee on all rounds. No group larger than a five-some is allowed per tee time.*

RAIN-OUT: If violent weather occurs, tee times will be moved back for a period of time up to 30 minutes. If the rain delay is longer than 30 minutes, the original schedule shall be used without moving any tee times back. The management will determine rain delays.

CHILDREN: Children 7-14 years of age must be accompanied by an adult on Saturday, Sunday, and holidays. *No children under age 7 are to be on the course at any time, with or without parents or adults.* Children are not to be left at the clubhouse while parents are golfing.

DRESS CODE: Appropriate attire is requested. Men are to wear shirts at all times both in the clubhouse and on the golf course.

PROFANITY: All members and guests are requested to refrain from the use of profanity in the clubhouse.

LADIES DAY: Ladies day is held every Wednesday, May through September, from 7am – 1:30pm. Men and female golfers under the age of 18 may not tee off before 1:30pm. The months of May and September a 9:30am shotgun will be held. In June, July and August the shotgun will be held at 9:00am. Tee times may also be made. Female members may make permanent tee times between 1:30pm – 3:00pm. Lunch is served from 11:30am – 1:00pm. Cards will start at 1:00pm. *Shareholders who pay maintenance fee will not be extended privileges on Wednesdays.*

MEN'S NIGHT: Men's night is held every Thursday April through October from 10am to close. Women and male golfers under the age of 18 may not tee off after 10am on Thursdays. Thursday tee times are permanent for the season and will be posted in the Pro Shop by the end of March. A tee time may be obtained by purchasing \$300 in club credit by the third Sunday in March. **A group will not receive a tee time until all members of that group have purchased the club credit.** *Shareholders who pay maintenance fee will not be extended privileges on Thursdays.* An evening steak fry will be held from 5:30pm – 10:00pm*. *Kitchen closing is at the discretion of the kitchen manager.

Daily Activities

MONDAY – KIDS DAY – June 8 through August 15 – Minimum age 7

Monday is the day in which junior golfers are especially encouraged to use the course. Between the hours of 8am & 11am the course is reserved for junior members. Juniors remaining on the course past 11am will not be supervised. The cost for non-members is \$60. On Sunday, August 23, there will be an awards dinner for the junior golfers and their families. All are welcome to attend. Immediately following the meal and awards will be the Family Big Cup golf event. Juniors will be provided with instruction in the areas of driving range, putting/chipping greens and course etiquette. They will have the opportunity to demonstrate their skills to earn a soda and a candy bar. If threatening weather is in the area, please call to find out if the program will be offered that day BEFORE you drop your junior off. If it is raining, but there is no lightning or other storm threats, the program will be offered and all golfers attending that day will be expected to be out golfing and not sitting in the clubhouse. Please arrange transportation in advance with your junior as long distance calls are not permitted to be made from the clubhouse. Please be sure your golfer comes prepared. Sunscreen, hat and a water bottle will help keep those hot days more enjoyable. Junior golfers are not allowed to operate riding carts (rental or private) during this program. Riding carts may only be operated by adult volunteers and Ma Cal Grove employees. This program is run by volunteers and we can never have enough. If you are available during this time, we would appreciate your help. You will not be required to give instruction. We just need more adult eyes and ears to make this a safe and fun environment for our junior golfers. If you are willing to help out, please see Kay.

TUESDAY MORNING SENIOR LEAGUE – TWO MAN SCRAMBLE

League will start on May 5 and run through September 15. All men who are age 50 or older in 2009 and are active members are eligible to participate. Please be at the Pro Shop by 9:15 to register and draw for partners. Tee off will be at 9:30am. Cost is \$3 per person each week. One dollar of weekly entry fee will go toward year-end league dinner on September 15. Handicap will play a part in determining pairings. Format will be a two-man best shot. Payback will be based on number of golfers each week. All ties will be decided by handicap holes. Winter rules will be played everywhere. Lunch will be available in Pro Shop following play. In case of rain, league will be played on the following Friday. For more information, contact Merrill Deters or Don Meiners.

TUESDAY NIGHT MEN'S LEAGUE – THREE MAN SCRAMBLE

Play begins May 19. The length of the season will be based on the number of teams. All men who are active members are eligible to participate. Teams will consist of four team members, with three playing on league night. Format will be three-man best shot/match play based on an established team handicap. The cost will be \$100 per team. JUNIOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

This tournament is for members up to age 18. It is held in July and August. All matches must be played by the deadline posted or must be forfeited. The tournament ends with a luncheon for the golfers, their families and any interested club members. The lunch and awards ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, August 23.

MEN'S CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

All men entering must have a handicap established by July 1 and must be registered and have paid a \$7.00 fee by July 1. Entrants MUST have membership dues paid. All matches must be played by the deadline or forfeited. The

championship flight entrants will play 18 holes each match. All other flights will play nine holes each match except the Championship of each flight which shall be 18 holes. Any entrant with a handicap of eight or less may declare to be in the Championship Flight. The men having the eight lowest handicaps must be in Championship Flight and will be seeded by handicap.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY INFORMATION

Purpose: The purpose of this auxiliary is to promote friendship among the members and to strengthen the organization. The auxiliary gives some financial support to the club.

Membership: Any woman who is the wife of a shareholder, or who owns stock in her own right and pays the required club dues, is a member of the women's auxiliary.

Benefits: Luncheons are held each Wednesday June through September for auxiliary members and their guests. Number and set up tables, award weekly prizes, post weekly scores and record them in Pro Shop, report weekly to the newspaper, award year-end prizes. Women's 500 rules:

1. Anyone who wishes to play should sign the list in advance or call the clubhouse to be put on the list.
2. If there are not enough players signed up to fill out table, the committee will recruit other women to play, phoning another auxiliary member is necessary. If their efforts are unsuccessful, the last ones to sign the list will be unable to play.
3. A non-shareholder guest may play cards a maximum of three times per year.
4. Each player antes 50 cents at the beginning of play. Money collected will be used for prizes.
5. The yearly prizes will be determined by using the nine highest scores for each person for games played during the months of June, July and August. To be eligible for the prizes, players must have the specified number of scores.
6. A total of \$25 will be awarded to the five highest scores.

We do have a food manager on staff and she may be contracted to prepare and serve your meal. If we prepare the meal, we will waive the clubhouse rent. You will pay a per plate price and will guarantee us number of plates. Check with clubhouse manager for availability and menus/prices.
